Subject: Concern regarding false allegations against Shri Lalboi Vaiphei and appeal for fair intervention

Hon'ble Sir,

The Kuki-Zo Council (KZC) would like to draw your kind attention to the false allegations made against Shri Lalboi Vaiphei, Chief of Leilon Vaiphei Village in Kangpokpi District, Manipur, in a representation reportedly submitted by certain Naga organisations to the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India, your good office, the Hon'ble Governor of Manipur, and the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Manipur. The contents of the said representation have since been widely circulated on social media platforms, resulting in defamation, ridicule, hate speech, and targeted attacks against Shri Lalboi Vaiphei.

It is deeply wrong and unethical to accuse any individual of a serious crime without any credible evidence. Shri Lalboi Vaiphei, as the Chief of Leilon Vaiphei Village, is a respected and responsible leader, not only among his own villagers but also among neighbouring communities. To the best of our knowledge, Shri Lalboi Vaiphei has absolutely no connection whatsoever with the alleged abduction of civilians. At the time the incident occurred, he was out of station for medical reasons.

The baseless allegations and malicious propaganda being spread against him have now endangered his personal safety and security. Such irresponsible accusations have created an atmosphere of hostility and placed his life at serious risk.

In view of the gravity of the situation, we earnestly urge the Government to conduct a fair and impartial investigation into the matter and clear the name of Shri Lalboi Vaiphei of these baseless allegations. We further request the Government to take necessary steps to prevent the circulation of such false accusations in order to ensure his safety, dignity, and protection.

The Kuki-Zo Council also appreciates the initiative of the Chief Minister of Manipur in holding discussions with the United Naga Council (UNC) regarding the prevailing situation. However, in the interest of fairness, justice, and balanced governance, we sincerely appeal to the Government to also engage in dialogue with Kuki-Zo leaders. Failure to do so may create a public perception that the Government is listening only to one side of the issue.

At this critical juncture, we further urge the Government to leave no stone unturned in rescuing the hostages, whether dead or alive, and to take all necessary measures to resolve this unfortunate situation once and for all. The Kuki-Zo people do not want another ethnic conflict, and every effort must be made to preserve peace, harmony, and coexistence among all communities.

It also appears that the merciless killing of the three senior Kuki-Zo pastors is being overshadowed by the hostage situation. There is a growing concern that public attention is being diverted away from the brutal murder of the three pastors.

We earnestly request your good office to make every possible effort to identify and bring to justice those responsible for this heinous crime against innocent church leaders who devoted their lives to serving humanity and promoting peace.

We hope and trust that your good office will take urgent and appropriate action in the larger interest of justice, peace, and public safety.
